Umpiring is an important component to Junior Football. We cannot play the game we love without officials. Our Junior Football Umpires are young men and women, many aged between 13yrs – 18yrs who, like our players train weekly to be part of our game. By training to become an umpire they are learn the rules of the game and are coached on how to apply them. Umpiring is so much more than blowing a whistle, our young umpires must be able to push them to stand up and apply the rules, they learn how to be brave, apply knowledge in a split second and how to read a game of football.

Yes – our umpires get paid. They are reimbursed a small amount in return for becoming an umpire, paying registration fees, undertaking accreditation, attending training and then umpiring junior football. Payment is not the only reason our Umpires are involved. They love the game, are committed to development and many – just like our players are now on a pathway to talent programs.

Umpire feedback in a safe and useful format is important to the development and training of our Junior Umpires. The attached form provides an opportunity for team volunteers – through their club committee – to provide both positive and constructive feedback about our Junior Umpires. This information will be used by the Umpire Coaches and the Junior Competition Management Team in Umpire Education.
